Photo at right shows said mailbox and iron gate with silhouettes of bears. Gate will be open. Karen will mark the driveway.




### **Notes from the Board**

So far, as of the date of this writing,

**Eighty-three** GCGAC members out of a total of about 94 current members reported receiving their covid-19 vaccinations. Last month, the tally was 80. Our little hypo graphic is nearly completely squirted out!


Nevada County Health Department reports that as of the date of this writing, the county has administered 81,148 doses of vaccine. Assuming each recipient takes two doses, and that the population of the county is about 100,000, the county is about 42% vaccinated. Compare that to the GCGAC: We're about 86%, and we haven't even heard back from all members, yet. Yea, team!



**COMIRNATY**® What's that? It's the name for the covid-19 vaccine being produced by BioNTech and Pfizer. The companies intend to supply 600 million doses of COMIRNATY to the European Union in 2021, covering

approximately two-thirds of the EU population. BioNTech also announced that recent stability studies show that the vaccine can be stored for 30 days at 2°C to 8°C, much higher temperature than originally specified.

How's your <u>technical German?</u> Pictured at left is Dennis Kuschel, an electronics engineer from Bremen, Germany. Modern computers are built using large-scale integrated circuits that contain millions of microscopic transistors. However, Dennis Kuschel has built a working computer using 2,495 <u>discrete</u> transistors, comprising a Central Processing Unit (CPU) that is the heart of the computer. He has named it "MyCPU." German Language Learners, see if you can understand this partial description from Herr Kuschel:

"Die MyCPU ist ein Prozessor, der komplett aus diskreten Logik-Gattern besteht. Das Projekt ist

immer weiter gewachsen, und mittlerweile ist aus dem CPU-Projekt ein ganzer Computer entstanden. Der Computer hat die folgenden Eigenschaften:

Er besteht überwiegend aus Bausteinen der 74er TTL-Serie. Keine hochintegrierten Bauteile wurden benutzt (außer der EPROMs, RAMs und UARTs).

Der Computer läuft mit maximal 8 MHz

verfügbare Hardware: 8 Bit CPU mit 8 MHz (die "MyCPU"), 1.03 MB RAM / 128 KB ROM, Interrupt Controller, Multi-I/O mit zwei seriellen Schnittstellen und einem parallelen Drucker-Port, LCD und PS2-Tastatur-Anschluß, IDE-Controller für 4 Festplatten, VGA Grafikkarte und Ethernet Controller."



This is the "CPU" which consists of:

Arithmetic Logic Unit (ALU) micro-code control unit decoder for control signals program counter (PC) register set and bus interface
