


### Notes from the Board




Lou Ann Schwartz near a Castle on the Rhine River near Kaub, Germany in 2019.


### Maifest at Turn Verein in Sacramento

# Everybody knows about Johann Strauss, the Waltz King, but do you know about these Strausses?





Joseph Strauss was the designer of the Golden Gate Bridge, and this statue near the bridge commemorates that. He was inspired by John A. Roebling, the famous German-American engineer who designed the Brooklyn Bridge.

Levi Strauss was the inventor of blue jeans. He was born in Buttenheim, Bavaria and immigrated to the US in 1847. His work jeans were patented in 1873 and Levi's achieved great popularity in the 1960's and 70's, explaining why so many older men wear them today.



Albert Straus (with one "s" at end) runs the Straus Family Creamery in Petaluma, California. The Straus Creamery was/is the **first certified organic creamery west of the Mississippi.** Albert's parents immigrated from Germany just before Hitler came to power. The creamery, founded in 1994, specializes in high-quality, organic, sustainable, environmentally-

conscious dairy products; their ice cream is served in the Bay Area's finest restaurants.


